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Voter Registration Deadline for the 2024 General Election is October 15th

FREEHOLD, NJ – Monmouth County Clerk Christine Giordano Hanlon is reminding residents that Tuesday, Oct. 15, is the voter registration deadline for those wishing to vote in the upcoming Nov. 5th General Election.

“The right to vote is the cornerstone of our democracy, and I encourage all eligible residents to make their voices heard by participating in the upcoming General Election,” said Clerk Hanlon.

Residents may register online via the State of New Jersey’s voter registration portal or in person at the Monmouth County Superintendent/Registrar of Elections Office located at 300 Halls Mills Road in Freehold. Additionally, residents may complete and mail the New Jersey Voter Registration form to the County Superintendent/Registrar of Elections Office or their hometown’s Municipal Clerk.

Voters can find the link to the State voter registration portal or can download the New Jersey voter registration application by visiting the County Clerk’s elections website at MonmouthCountyVotes.com or mobile app, Monmouth County Votes. A driver’s license

or the last four digits of the applicant's Social Security number must be entered on the New Jersey voter registration form and online portal.

In order to register to vote, residents must be at least 17 years of age and a U.S. citizen. Only individuals who are at least 18 years of age on Election Day will be permitted to vote in the election.
